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### From the Founder's Desk

Radha, a young single mother and eager learner could learn first three chapters of the primer with her son in a weeks' time. And then, she had to opt for a 12-hour job, with 2 more hours on commuting. Her priority changed and could not see any benefits of being literate. Razina, mother of three children, studied up to class Vth, an eager learner, who wished to pursue education. However, due to her husband's health issues, she had to start working and her education took a back seat.

There are crores of Radha, Razina, Rabi, Rahul, who has a story behind their growing up as non-literate. CSC started the year with training of teachers on teaching such adults who missed an opportunity to become literate. And most of the time it was that situational need which kept them away from formal education, where they had to choose between family poverty and self-education.

Online course on Certificate in Counselling Skills aimed at providing a base to the professionals working in the helping service sectors. Three batches were conducted during the year. through experiential teaching, to make them aware of counselling skills and their implementation process, and to help them to be better equipped with counselling skills.

'Sab Pade Sab Bade', an initiative of Noida Police to engage children residing in the slums of Noida for couple of hours during the day in a non-formal set up and work on behavioural changes and various areas of life skills started in this year and CSC was one of the six implementing agencies identified by Noida Police and assigned Juggis of Sector 76, Noida. The initiative was formally inaugurated in the august presence of Sh.Pankaj Singh, MLA Noida and Sh. Alok Singh IPS, Police Commissioner, Noida, as well as Mrs. Vrinda Shukla, IPS, DCP, Noida.

To provide skill enhancement and job ready training in retail sector to the young girls of 18 years and above and class XII pass TERRAIN-HER-ASCENT conducted three months online course with CSC as partner in Noida, from October-December, 2021.

CSC expressed its gratitude to the donors who supported the cause by extending generous contributions in cash and in kind throughout the year. We profusely express our heartfelt thanks to the Honorable Advisors and Board Members, as well as team members for their untiring guidance and commitment towards achieving the desired outcomes.

We, at CSC, come together and contribute towards a most needed positive social change by engaging communities creatively and effectively to co-create a better future. ## Gaon Mera: Green and Clean Community - Environment building

To live life in a beautiful village is the dream for many of us and it always remains as a dream as we are constantly in search of livelihood, from better to best. More than thirty percent of rural youth migrates to metro cities and nearby urban towns in search of livelihood. As they come with a purpose to earn livelihood, they come with a vision to earn money and go back to the village once they earn enough. However, they never earn enough to go back to their village and in the process they remain as a migrant in a small town or in a big city throughout their life. Gaon Mera focuses on bringing all shareholders of a community to one platform and co-create the dream of living in a clean and green environment a reality.

#### Ajeevan Siksha: Lifelong learning

Ignited Minds: Focuses on children, adolescents and youth in building up their self-esteem and training them to be socially responsible.

**Khilta Bachpan**: The programme aims at helping children to enhance their learning abilities through focused intervention and playful activities.

**Health for life**: A healthy body with a healthy mind, focuses on people's awareness about health care, emotional and psychological well -being, counselling and change towards positive thought process.

Learn and teach: To encourage adults and senior citizens to learn new skills as well as excel in the skills they have. A certification of prior learning to such skilled persons to facilitate teaching to the younger generations.

#### **SwabalambyHum:Economic empowerment**

Empowerment comes along with the economic independence of self. This could be achieved by enhancing one's skills and knowledge. To facilitate youth to learn skills to produce and earn livelihood, thereby, contributing towards a sustainable economic growth of the self and family, CSC supports a training cum production centre at the Community.

#### **Action Research:**


This area is mainly responsible for conducting research and providing policy feedback and inputs to policymakers. Publishing books, reports, policy briefs and promoting innovative development techniques and approaches are also part of its responsibilities.

#### Profile of the beneficiaries

Centre for Social Change (CSC) was conducting its change-oriented implementation activities at village Barola, Sector 49, Noida since February, 2018.

CSC was working with the families of marginalised-migrated families mostly from Uttar Pradesh and other neighbouring states, such as Bihar and Jharkhand.

During the year the centre provided learning opportunities to children, who were out of school (total 20), studying up to class III (25), studying in class IV-V (Total 35), mathematics for students from VI-X (total 25), a total of 115 children. Reference to the BMI index of all these children nearly 65% of the children were malnourished.



For children studying up to class III, 75% of mothers were working as domestic helper, whereas, children studying from class IV-V, about 40% mothers were housewives, and for children studying in class VI onwards, only 5% mothers were working as domestic helpers. 65% of mothers were not literate.

Fathers were working in various capacities such as driver, e-rickshaw puller, tailor, vegetable seller and others. Average income of the families are Rs.15000/- per month.

From the second quarter of the year CSC started its intervention in the slum of sector 76, where majority of the families were migrants from West Bengal, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Almost all the mothers are domestic helpers and fathers are vegetable sellers.

#### **Activities briefly:**

#### Maa-ki-Pathsala – Empowering Mothers through Literacy

The CSC community is primarily composed of migrant and marginalised families, where over 65% of mothers are non-literate. While many of these women wish to learn, financial responsibilities keep them occupied with work, leaving little time for personal growth. For mothers in their late thirties, reluctance to return to learning poses an additional challenge. Recognising the transformative impact of educating mothers, CSC identified adult female literacy as a key focus area, calling for trained volunteers to take the lead.

On 3rd April 2021, the Centre for Social Change organised online training programme for volunteer teachers, led by Dr. Mridula Seth, an expert in adult literacy. The session was based on a literacy primer developed the Department Development Communication Extension, Lady College, New Delhi. The training emphasised the significance of adult education, teaching methods learners, and strategies creating an encouraging learning environment.



On **3rd April 2021**, the Centre for Social Change organised an **online training programme** for volunteer teachers, led by **Dr. Mridula Seth**, an expert in adult literacy. The session was based on a literacy primer developed by the **Department of Development Communication and Extension**, **Lady Irwin College**, **New Delhi**. The training emphasised the significance of adult education, effective teaching methods for adult learners, and strategies for creating an encouraging learning environment.

A total of **20 volunteers** attended the programme, along with active participation from CSC staff. The initiative marked a step forward in building an inclusive, literate, and empowered community, starting with mothers as the foundation of change.

#### COMMUNITY RESPONSE

Approximately 50% resisted getting vaccination initially, but after discussions 80% agreed to it in the end.



On 29 May 2021, the Centre for Social Change organised a Covid Vaccination Awareness Programme with community members to address misconceptions and hesitancy around vaccination. Twenty residents, including Mala Devi, Ajay, Sanjay, Chanchal, Prem Sahani, Asha Devi, Rekha, Pushpa, Anita, Gayatri, Dropati, Seema, Kanti, Ramprasad, Veena, Sonu, Gomti, Om Prakash, Vijayanti Pandey, and Rinki participated in the event.

Initially, nearly 50% of the participants resisted the idea of getting vaccinated. Through open clarifications dialogue, on safety, discussions about the benefits of immunisation, community members gradually overcame their doubts. By the end of the session, 80% of participants committed to taking the vaccine.

The programme proved to be highly interactive and impactful, fostering trust, dispelling myths, encouraging collective responsibility and towards health and safety.

#### The discussion brought together eminent educationists:




## Greeting Card Making Competition on 11th August, 2021

The day blended creativity, cultural celebration, and public health awareness, engaging youth and community members in a meaningful way while reinforcing the spirit of solidarity and proactive action.




