Mothers' literacy took priority, supported through door-to-door surveys and training. CSC worked closely with the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit of Noida Police, which remained actively involved in activities at the Sector 76 centre throughout the year.

A significant milestone was the announcement of the Smt. Kamla Devi Agarwal Scholarship for Girls, aimed at supporting higher education, generously sponsored by Smt. Usha Agrawal on CSC's fifth foundation day. The cricket team of Lotus Panache, Sector 110, paid a heartfelt tribute to Mani Bhai on his first death anniversary by donating cricket kits to CSC children — a memory they will cherish forever.

The year was marked by celebrations of important days, awareness programmes, and skill-based activities such as art, craft, and stitching, which enhanced children's fine motor skills. Another batch successfully completed the Certificate in Counselling Skills course.

After five years, CSC shifted its community centre to a new location in Barola. While the change posed challenges in accessibility, the team, community, and supporters ensured the journey continued. Since its inception on 5th February 2018, CSC has remained committed to monitoring and evaluating its work to ensure positive, impactful change.

CSC extends heartfelt gratitude to its donors, partners, and community, inviting all to join in the mission of making change visible.

A total of 195 children from migrated and marginalised families enrolled during the year in Khilta bachpan programme at Barola and Sector 76 centre. Children were enrolled in two batches at Barola centre.

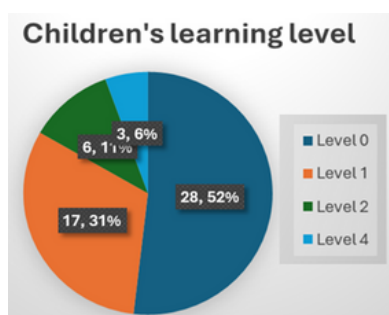
Out of school children enrolment ratio in Barola centre: Total no. 54

Gender ratio: 31 girls and 23 boys.

Attendance: 82% percent children regularly attended the classes.

28 children were at level 0 – not -literate

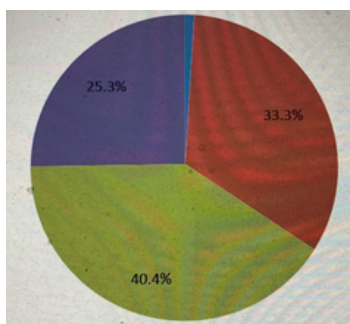
- 17 children were at level 1 – able to identify some alphabets and numbers.

- From level 1, 1 child reached level 4, 6 children reached level 3.



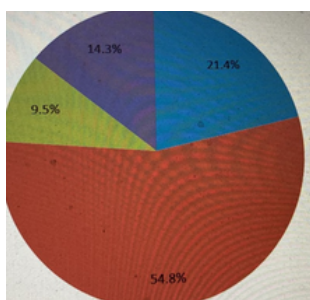
- Gender Ratio-There were 44 boys and 55 girls in the after school programme in Barola centre.

Under Swabalamby Hum programme Cutting and Tailoring centre at Barola catered to the learning need of women and girls who were learning cutting, stitching, embroidery, hand stitching and other craft work. Upcycling of clothes, self styled designing and innovative ideas and creativity were encouraged at the centre. Learners were trained to calculate making cost and labour cost and calcute price forvtheir product.



Out of Twenty Three (23)students enrolled for Cutting and Tailoring course, 12 students successfully completed their course. Course completion rate 53%.

Reason of Cutting and Tailoring Drop Out- 3 Students have their Board Exam, 4 students interested in learning for two months only, 1 student got married, 3 students shifted to another place.



Activities at CSC

Khilta Bachpan

Khilta Bachpan is not just about happy childhood, it is more about learning happily. Post Covid, many of these little ones had challenges in getting back to the routine of restrictions, learning and discipline. Number of out of school children increased due to lack of awareness and initiative on parents side in getting children's Aadhar card made. The other reason was learning loss during the Covid phase and children could not come up to the expected level of learning as per their age.

CSC india kept children engaged in all types of activities including art and craft work, basic computer, laptop operations, using of laptop for online meetings, learning from online lessons. Various competitions were organised amongst children dividing them in three categories, such as : Out of school, Class I-III and Class IV-VI. The purpose of such competitions were to help children finish a task within a given time and do their best.

Learning enhancements competitions organised at CSC included singing, dance, quiz, diya making, hand embroidery alongwith the following regular competitions:

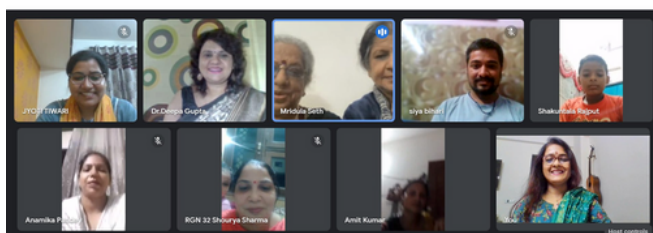
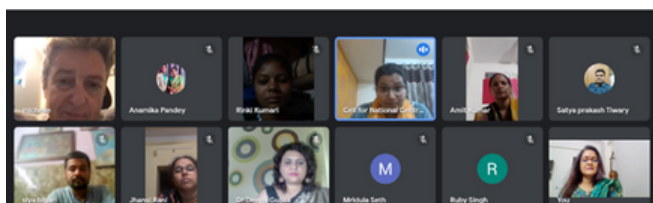

The interactive session was conducted to help mothers and sisters understand the importance of learning and demo session was conducted to give hands on training to CSC team.



Facilitating mothers to become literate was CSC's effort since very beginning. Though mothers expressed their initial excitement, quickly they found it difficult to manage. CSC adopted following approaches to facilitate mother's learning at Barola.

·Reaching mothers at their home at a mutually convenient time. Door to door visit approach was the recent one which started from 5th April,2022 onwards

·Encouraging children from class VII onwards to go for mutual teaching learning sessions was started during Covid phase.

Forming WhatsApp group of willing mothers and sharing recorded video learning lessons also started a year back.

A total of 35 mothers expressed their willingness to become literate. However, their involvement and progress needed to be given more attention and efforts.



Certificate in Counselling Skills

Centre for Social Change conducted an online Certificate Course in Counselling aimed at spreading awareness and building foundational skills in the field of counselling. The course provided participants with practical knowledge on how to approach and conduct effective counselling sessions, covering key topics such as active listening, empathy, emotional support, and ethical practices.

What made this course truly impactful was the diverse participation from individuals across different parts of the world. Learners from various cultural and professional backgrounds came together on a common platform to enhance their understanding of mental health and counselling techniques.

Through interactive online sessions, real-life case studies, and expert guidance, participants gained valuable insights into the role of a counsellor and the importance of mental well-being in today's world. This initiative reflected the ongoing commitment to capacity-building and mental health awareness on a global scale.

Mid Day Meal Program

CSC provided food to nearly hundred children everyday. The food was cooked at Barola centre kitchen. One time meal was cooked, distributed among students at both Barola and Sec 76 Centre. It aimed to reduce classroom hunger and improve students overall health and nutrition. As food cooked at centre's kitchen, hygiene was maintained properly. From Monday to Saturday, menu was decided for everyday such as Moong Dal Khichdi, Wheat Daliya, Soaked Channa fry, Namkeen Chawal, Poha, Suji Halwa etc. Food was not only healthy but also tasty. The project continued for more than six Months from September 2022 to February 2023. Increased attendance and slightly higher BMI index, nutrition level in children were the visible outcome.



Awareness on mensural health and hygiene:

Noida Citizen Forum conducted an awareness talk on mensural health and hygiene and distributed sanitary napkin packets to the women and girls on 1st April, 2022. On behalf of Noida Citizen Forum Women Cell, Smt. Indrani Mukherjee and Smt. Garima Tripathi talked about the importance of knowing about one's mensural health and taking preventative measures as well as necessary treatment as and when necessary. Smt. Garima Tripathi mentioned that if needed Noida Citizen Forum would arrange for experts visit to the centre for health check up. Dr. Bani Bora emphasized on the importance of maintaining hygiene specially during monthly mensurating days and profusely thanked Noida Citizen Forum for the initiative.



Introducing Entrepreneurial Skills

In an effort to develop entrepreneurial skills amongst women and youth, Alay Barah, Director ICCO had an interactive session with the mothers of CSC children on 15th May, 2022. Few mothers expressed their interest to start tea stall, grocery shop, vegetable shop, cosmetic shop, boutique etc.

On a follow up visit on 7th June, 2022, they were introduced to natural household food products and encouraged to sale the products so that they could develop conceptual understanding of words like incentives, commission, profits from sale etc. Sample packets were distributed to those who were interested to take up sale. There were samples of designer kurtas, shirt, shawl, table mat etc. prepared from handloom clothes, which were appreciated by the partners.



Success comes with action and commitment:

Sunita and Rekha opened tailoring shop in Barola.

Karishma and Kusuma started taking orders at home from neighbourhood.

All the others were given opportunities to practice at CSC including students.

Cut pieces were provided by CSC to improve skills as well as design creative products by using cut pieces.

Training and Internship

Capacity building of youth volunteers on teaching non-literate learners

Dr. Mridula Seth, Advisor and Dr.Bani Bora, Founder conducted capacity building and training of youth volunteers on teaching no-literate learners at CSC Barola centre on 1st April and 8th May,2022.



CSC team members and students from class VII onwards were trained under this program. On 1st April,2022, how to use a Primer developed for non-literate learners in the age group of 15 years and above were demonstrated. Primer lessons were available in hard copy for face to face teaching and learning and also in digital mode for self-learning, which were produced by Dr.Mridula Seth. The training manuals and Primers for non-literate learners were designed by the Department of Development Communication and Extension, Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi, under the able guidance of Dr.Mridula Seth.

Internship, School of Commerce, SVKM's NMIMs Indore

Six students from SVKM's NMIMs Indore, Madhya Pradesh, namely Shresth Goyal, Akshar Raj, Pritika Mathur, Aditya Sachdeva, Kartik Rastogi, Srinjay Paul had their internship assignment at Centre for Social Change from 4th-19th June, 2022. Apart from participating in CSC's routine activities, the students were encouraged to have first-hand understanding of learning



needs of marginalised children. Students found it alarming to see the difference in level of learning opportunities for children in Government Schools vis-à-vis elite Private Schools. An exposure to understand diversity in humanity with an empathetic approach would be the take away from their internship at CSC.

Memorandum of Understanding

Centre for Social Change had an MOU for the academic year 2022-23 with GL Bajaj Educational Institutions, Greater Noida, UP. Forty students and faculties visited CSC Barola and sector 76 community and had an experiential learning interaction with the migrated communities residing in urban slums. Students distributed their collection of stationaries, clothes for children and sarees to the community people. An understanding to look forward towards increasing people's participation for bringing a positive social change.
