Beneficiaries Profile

Centre for Social Change works with marginalised migrated communities living in slums of Noida. People are both interstate or intrastate migrants, mostly from Uttar Pradesh and neighbouring States, such as Bihar, Jharkhand and West Bengal. CSC conducts its activities in the centres located in Sector 76 and Barola - Sector 49 in Noida.

Migrated population faces many challenges when it comes to relocate their families and work for livelihood. The challenges are bigger when such families belong to marginalised communities. Children from these families are highly vulnerable as they would be left behind in the neighbourhood throughout the day to fend for themselves, when their parents would be out to earn their livelihood.

The factors which affects the education and behavioural aspects of marginalised children in the age group 6-14 years, are mainly:

• Higher rate of non-literacy amongst parents leading to lack of awareness about importance of education.









- Location of the habitations of marginalized communities being mostly far from government schools where free education could be received.
- Resposibility of the elder siblings to take care of the household chores and younger siblings, when parents are away working for their livelihood, prevents them from going to school at an appropriate age.
- Children's natural attraction to go for begging on the street or nearby markets in group and then getting used to it.
- ·Non-availability of required documents for school admission lead to deprivation of children from formal schooling, there by creating a vicious cycle of learning poverty amongst the marginalized children.

I. Gao Mera: Community Environment Building: Awareness generation Yoga Day Celebration

On 21st June 2023, CSC celebrated 9th International Yoga Day at the center, after a week-long workshop on yoga. Yoga brings together physical and mental disciplines to achieve a peaceful body and mind, it helps manage stress and anxiety and keeps you relaxing. It also helps in increasing flexibility, muscle strength and body tone. It improves respiration, energy and vitality. Students performed yoga learnt during the workshop and encouraged the younger ones to join them.



Human Rights Day Celebration

On 10th December, 2023 CSC celebrated 75th anniversary of International Human Rights Day. Theme for this year is "Freedom, Equality and Justice for All". In the afternoon, the day was celebrated with full vigour at the community, where hundred children and forty mothers actively participated. While majority of the mothers were not aware of one's right, they related it with their duties to serve the family members, especially husbands. Children presented a powerful



message on "Importance of Education in Women's Life" through a drama. CSC Board members and community members were present on the occasion and appreciated community participation.

In the evening, CSC organized an online webinar. Eminent speakers were SP-Chitrakoot, Vrinda Shukla, IPS, Social Change Maker - Akanksha Singh, Advocate- Nisha Rai and Founder – Dr.Bani Bora.



Dr. Bora presented a brief on understanding of Human Rights by marginalized communities, especially women. Advocate Nisha Rai shared information on prevailing laws on human rights. Smt. Akanksha Singh emphasised on creating a skill-based learning environment so that financial upliftment could be ensured for the marginalised masses. IPS Vrinda Shukla presented the real life challenges of marginalised communities, where lack of education, financial obligations lead to larger problems. Mrs. Shukla stated that reaching out to marginalized children with a holistic approach would help in ensuring equality to some extent. Dr. Mridula Seth concluded the webinar with a thought provoking statement of giving back to the society in a meaningful way, so that freedom, equality and justice could be ensured for all. Adv. Rupalim Bora smoothly moderated the webinar. There were more nearly hundred online participants who attended the webinar.

World AIDS Day

World AIDS Day 2023, under the theme, "Let communities lead", is an opportunity to reflect on the progress made to date, to raise awareness about the challenges that remain to achieve the goals of ending AIDS by 2030 and to mobilize all stakeholders to jointly redouble efforts to ensure the success of the HIV response. This theme makes us believe that only together we can fight this deadly virus, with right knowledge and right efforts in the right direction can bring us desired goal.

On December 1st, 2023, CSC organised an awareness seminar for students, where information regarding HIV-AIDS was presented to adolescent participants through a structured **group discussion.** An environment was created to encourage students to ask questions and apprehension related to sex-education, precautions and preventive measures. rough discussion between students and teachers, we were able to remove shyness among students, spread awareness about HIV-AIDS and its prevention.

Republic Day Celebration

CSC celebrated **75th Republic Day on 26 January 2024.** Being the 75th anniversary of Republic Day, it was additionally special day. The occasion are celebration of the country's progress, democracy and rich cultural background. This year's celebration was more special for CSC as both Barola's centre and Sector 76 students celebrated it together at Sector 76 centre. All Barola's students conducted rally from Barola to Sector 76. Students were full of enthusiasm during this rally. On the way passer-by also boosted students enthusiasm for the day, in middle sector 76 students joined others and all lead to sector 76. All the students sung Patriotic songs together. This day was thoroughly enjoyed by all teachers, students and guest. Poha and Halwa was distributed among all the students.





International Women's Day

A webinar was held on the occasion of International Women's Day on the theme Literacy, Financial Inclusion and Farm Women in Assam. Insightful deliberations by the subject matter specialist from the Krishi-Vikas-Kendra's of Assam made the webinar sting and thought provoking.



World Happiness Day Celebration



The renowned mathematician Srinivasan Ramanujan, whose works had a widespread impact both in India and around the world, is the driving force behind the establishment of Mathematics Day in that country, amanujan was born in 1887 to an R Iyengar



Brahmin family in Erode, Tamil Nadu. Despite having little formal schooling, he mastered trigonometry at the age of 12 and created a number of his own theorems. In 1914, Ramanujan travelled to Britain, where Hardy helped him enrolled in Trinity College, Cambridge. In 1918, he also became a Fellow of the Royal Society, one of the youngest individuals to hold this prestigious status. In the remembrance of Srinivasan Ramanujan, we at Centre for Social Change (CSC) celebrated this auspicious day with the students, conducted many mathematics game in the class which children's enjoyed thoroughly and after all these activities we have shown one short movie based on the life of great mathematician Srinivasan Ramanujan.

Developing 21st century skill competencies for marginalized children and contributing towards the positive changes in their lives are the mottos of WECARE@NEXTROVE through the following activities:

- Introducing foundational literacy and numeracy amongst children and getting them used to the culture of learning to read and write.
- With the enhanced reading writing abilities amongst children, CSC focuses on improving it to the age appropriate learning to facilitate admission in formal schooling system.
- ·Facilitate to develop and enhance 21st century skills, such as thinking skills, social skills and self management skills. Basic computer learning, digital literacy-such as using of laptop for online sessions, safe internet use, art and craft work, etc.
- ·Various competitions were organised amonst children to help children learning to complete a task within a given time and give their best during that time period.

A total of 60 students were enrolled so far under basic computer course, alongwith sessions on digital literacy, that is the ability to use technology to find, evaluate, and communicate information as well as using technology responsibly.





Capacity building programmes for youth from all over India is also one of the important areas of community intervention of CSC.





Certificate in Counselling Skills:

Directorate of Extension Education, Assam Agricultural University collaborated to custom design the certificate course in counselling course as per the requirements of subject matter specialists of Krishi Vigyan Kendra. Accordingly new components were added to the curriculum, where 20 participants actively participated in the course.





Maa-ki-Pathshala: Door to door survey (19th January-23rd January)

From 19th January to 23rd January, CSC conducted survey in Barola covering 160 family area in Gali no 15,16,17,18. During survey we interacted with approx 50 women, most of them is working as Maids in the nearby society. 60% of them is non literate. Many have shown interest in our stitching course and few of them also want to study.

One women who want to study shared that she was not able to study because there was no school in their village and parents didn't allowed her to go to nearly village for




study. Also interacted with approx 40 out of school students, 15 of them got admission with CSC and . rest children's have responsibility of their siblings. One girl Radha who is 9 year old is unable to go to school because having responsibility of four younger siblings, one is 4 month old.

- · Migration
- Younger sibling responsibility
- Lack of awareness of parents on importance of education
- · Economic condition

To reach out to parents, specially mothers CSC took help of their children and motivated them to assist CSC to help their mothers become literate. On 25th February, 2024, module 1, in Hindi were distributed to 23 students to facilitate their mothers' learning at home.



Emotional Well-being Workshop

On 18th and 19th February, 2024, CSC organised 2 days emotional wellbeing workshop conducted by Ms. Shabnam Yadav. It was attended by CSC teachers, student's mothers and girls from stitching course. There were total 16 participants in this workshop. Major components of the workshop were learning relaxation through breathing techniques, guided meditation, importance of helping others and forgiveness, learning self work and self love. All the participants thoroughly enjoyed and learnt through active participation in the workshop.



III. Swabalamby Hum: Economic empowerment Rakhi Making Competition

On 29th August 2023, CSC organised Rakhi making competition on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. Total 9 girls those learning stitching participated . It enhanced their aesthetic sense and creativity, culture and traditions. A sense of pride was also instilled in them. All other students at Center those were observing competitors making Rakhi were thoroughly enjoyed this event. After displaying rakhi's we ask all the students to decide about the winner, this activity increases their decision making ability as team because decision has to be taken by consensus.



Mehandi art training

On 23rd January, CSC organised Mehandi Competition among all the girls who learnt Mehandi art from CSC. Total 8 girls participated in it. Main Criteriafor the competition:

- 1) Mehandi design should be unique and creative.
- 2) Mehandi design must cover one hand.



Gender Insights:

 Girls made up a higher proportion of children in the "Underweight" and "Slightly Underweight" categories.

BMI Category Breakdown

Normal Weight:

The largest category, representing **over one-third of the children.** These children fall within the healthy BMI range for their age, indicating balanced nutrition and growth.

Moderately Underweight:

 A significant portion of the children fall into this category. While not acutely undernourished, they are at risk of falling into more severe nutritional deficiency if not addressed.

Underweight:

 Many children are categorized as underweight, indicating possible chronic nutritional issues such as insufficient calorie or protein intake.

Slightly Underweight:

 A smaller group shows only mild deviations from the healthy range. With minor dietary improvements, these children could reach normal BMI levels.

- Boys were more represented in the "Moderately Underweight" and "Normal Weight" categories.
- Normal BMI distribution was somewhat better among males, suggesting slight nutritional gaps affecting female participants.

Age Trends (General Observations):

- Children aged **7 to 10** showed the **widest spread of BMI categories**, indicating variability during mid-childhood growth spurts.
- Ages 12–13 had several cases of "Slightly Underweight," suggesting the need for continued nutritional support during adolescence.

Conclusion & Recommendations:

- While a healthy proportion of the children are within the normal weight range, more than 60% are below optimal BMI levels, highlighting the need for nutritional interventions.
- Proposed actions:
 - o Regular health screenings and BMI tracking.
 - o Nutrition education for families and caregivers.
 - o Inclusion of supplementary meals through school or community centres.
 - o Gender-sensitive interventions ensuring girls receive equal nutritional support.

V. Volunteering and internship

Internship Program

CSC provided 3 months internship program to 5 Delhi University students. Students prepared social profile of the community and engaged children in a productive way through different teaching learning materials and activities. During the internship, students assisted CSC teachers as well as interacted with the community, specially mothers to understand their need and expectations from CSC. Workshops on health and hygiene, nutrition in home cooked food and importance of literacy and education were the three important messages they tried to convey to the community, specially mothers during the internship.

To provide a platform to perform cultural aspects of their learning CSC organized a cultural event at the Civil Service Officers Institute, CSOI, Chanakyapuri on 17th June, 2023 from 6.30-8.00 PM.

General Manager, CSOI, Captain Shiv Kumar Goel welcomed the members, all the children and guests of Centre for Social Change and its Founder Director, Dr.Bani Bora on a very encouraging note. Captain Goel then led the distinguished guests to light the lamp and inaugurate the event formally.




